AutoSolo events are one of the fastest growing motorsport disciplines in the UK and the reason for their ever-increasing popularity is primarily cost, or lack of cost to be more precise! They are similar to Auto Tests but only utilise forward gears and most importantly the vehicle you use is the one you drive to work or the shops on a regular basis.

In addition to using your everyday drive you don't need a helmet or fire-resistant race suit, nor do you need a competition licence. It all sounds too simple to be true but that's why its popularity is growing faster than Lewis Hamilton's Mercedes!

AutoSolo events have a series of short timed courses run on a sealed surface and are suitable for a variety of cars be it a family saloon or hatchback. Driver skill is more important than speed or power, as while timing does count, accuracy in following the correct route and not touching any of the cones that define it is of far more relevance to your result.

Competitors are split into three groups, one competing, one resting with the third marshaling and that's where the waterproof coat comes in, as it's very handy if it happens to be raining!
